U-M Virtual Sites

If you get the odd project task that requires some specialized software, but the budget's too tight or justifying the expense for a single use doesn't make sense, then Virtual Sites is a great alternative. This useful service is offered by U-M ITS to the Ann Arbor campus and lets you log in remotely to a Campus Computing Sites Windows computer and use specialized software on as as-needed basis. Campus Computing Sites have a wide variety of software available for image creation, audio and video, statistics, GIS applications, and many other tasks. Put the files you'll be working on in a Google Drive or Box folder and after you've logged into Virtual Sites, you can download them in the remote space and get to work! Be sure you save back to your folder when you're done.
