Year in Review

- Official "End of Year" report, assembled by SRO for SRO
- (Mainly) Reflects our fiscal year (July June)
- Highlight current SRO status and some initiatives
 - Generally we don't highlight projects
 - Not intended to be comprehensive
 - We welcome suggestions on what to include!
- Final version posted on SRO Intranet (Home Page)
 - Shared with key stakeholders in SRC/ISR



"A significant focus of FY2022 was our successful transition back to in-person data collection in the field, and other on-site activities in Ann Arbor."






Facts & Comparisons



- •SRO worked on **42 unique projects**. Seven of those projects had multiple funding mechanisms. Multiple funders are sometimes necessary given the total costs of some projects, but it adds a lot of complexity to cost monitoring.
- •Volumes are on the way up again! We processed 2,348 interviewer expense reports (vs. 1,414 in FY21) and 618 travel advances (9 in FY21!).
- •We processed \$249,115 in respondent payments (\$6,460 in FY21!).
- •We reimbursed \$239,360 for mileage, which is 409,162 miles (\$5,039 in FY21!)
- •A total of 161 new interviewers were hired in FY22. In 2021, we didn't hire any interviewers due to the hiring freeze.





Interviewer Hours

Resuming In-Person Training

- •In-person trainings started in January 2022
 - MTF Winter Location (SSL)
 - •HRS Field Leader training (Field)
- •Full scale HRS training started in Feb 2022 with 135 interviewers, including 72 new hires
- On-going COVID compliance challenges
 - Travel
 - •Monitoring and following up with COVID vaccination compliance prior to the full UM system being in place
 - Monitoring daily ResponsiBLUE testing compliance
 - Physical distancing and masking protocols



Resuming In-Person Data Collection

- Substantial hesitancy from interviewers, including new hires
 - Fewer on-staffers applied for projects than expected
- •Overall, one- and three-month interviewer attrition rates were greater than in recent years
 - This was particularly true for Field new hires



Special Initiatives

- •Finalized program in R (analysis software) to streamline creation of interactive segment maps for interviewers with an offline version when no internet coverage is available
- •Developed an in-house auto scheduler for the SSL to cover project needs, make suitable interviewer assignments to projects, and "fairly" distribute assignments/shifts across interviewers
- •Developed a new budgeting tool to automate the creation of budgets (with new functionality around multi-mode projects) from design notes



More Special Initiatives

- •Created a Python Application Infrastructure for SRO and built 16 new applications or utilities to improve or simplify data management tasks, improve synchronization across SRO systems, and enable web form automation and automated scoring
- •Created and successfully piloted a novel technical approach to remote, intervieweradministered, Woodcock-Johnson cognitive assessments using Blaise and Zoom-based video interviewing, screen sharing, and remote annotation capabilities
- •Significant updates and improvements to SurveyTrak International and our Field User Management tool (FUM) to enable local (non-SRO) data manager and field supervisors to manage the massive scope of the India Human Development Project (~56,000 HH's, 24 instruments, 10 languages, 800+ unique interviewers)



Consultations

In FY22, SRO provided consultation in sampling design, questionnaire design, or data collection best practices to 68 research initiatives outside of SRO

- 47 for U-M departments or Michigan Medicine
- 9 for external colleges and universities
- 12 for various foundations, institutes, private companies








Fiscal Year 2022 Financial Summary

- •We completed \$31.5M in total **sponsored** project work, generating \$9.3M in indirect cost recovery fees (IDC).
- -Represents a 10.9% *increase* in IDC volume compared with FY21. SRO generated a **very** high effective IDC rate of 41.9% in 2022, similar to the FY2021 IDC at 41.3%.
- -Completed \$7.6M less (19.4% less) in sponsored work than our "medium" estimate at the start of the fiscal year.
- —We had a \$4.5M overhead budget allocation and ended the year with an underrun of \$103K (2.3% underrun).

Rules

- Each table is a team. All Zoom participants form a single, additional, team.
- Each Thompson team has a packet:
 - 1 sheet to record the name of your team
 - o 24 answer sheets, 8 for each of 3 rounds of questions
 - 24 wager sheets, 8 for each of 3 rounds of questions
 - Note: The remote Zoom team will answer and wager via private chat with Grant
- We will play 3 rounds of 8 questions each. We will display and read each question out loud, one at a time.
- For each answer, your team will choose the wager associated with your level of confidence. An 8 means you are very confident, a 1 means you are not at all confident in answering correctly. Each number can only be used once per round, so choose carefully.

More rules

- Once the question is read and displayed your team will have 90 seconds to:
 - Write your answer (neatly!) on the appropriate answer sheet.
 - Choose a wager sheet.
 - Place the two at the edge of your table.
 - NOTE: Our remote team will send a private chat to Grant Benson. Your chat should include the question #, answer, and wager. Grant will write them down on the appropriate answer sheet.
- Our helpers will pick up your sheets after each question and bring them to the scorers table.
- Once we've picked up all the sheets we will display the answer, followed quickly by the next question. (The game will move quickly!)



Scoring

- Our official scorers, Ivanna and Fischer, will be recording your answers and wagers on our scoring spreadsheet sheet while you continue on to the next question.
- Your official score for each question will be either:
 - 0 if you answer wrong
 - the value of your wager if you answer correctly
- The maximum total score for any round of 8 questions = 36 points. (8+7+6+5+4+3+2+1)
- We will display the cumulative team scores and ranking after each round.
- A perfect score for all three rounds = 108 points.
- If there is a tie score after three rounds, remaining teams will answer one additional question, with a wager less than or equal to their current score.

The most important rules

- Do not shout out your answers!
- Use of electronic devices to look up answers is strictly prohibited! This is on the honor system, especially for remote participants.

Cheaters will be asked to tell a 5 minute story about the shame they felt the first time they were caught cheating as a child! :-)




