
Subunit Calendar User Suggestions:

- Document only time away of at least one full day and select "All day".
- Use the following abbreviations:
 - oOOTO (inclusive of Vac, Planned Medical Absence, Family Care, etc.)
 - oTraining/Conf


Since OOTO is also documented in individuals' calendars, cross-subunit teams are encouraged to use meeting invitations to look at staff availability on key dates (e.g. when scheduling trainings).

Key Production Dates

Did you know access to the most recent Key Production Dates document is available on the intranet? (Please see the screenshot below, big blue arrow, for location.) This document is reviewed and updated during the Project/Production meeting every two weeks, but project teams can submit updates at any time by using the "Submit an Update" tab on the Key Support Dates spreadsheet.

The Community College Study (Jeffrey Albrecht)







The Community College Study (CCS) is a three-wave, longitudinal, mixed-methods study of first-time students across four racially and economically diverse colleges in OH, MD, CA, and TX. The project is funded by the non-profit: Ascendium Education Group, whose mission is to make education and training beyond high school a reality for learners from low-income backgrounds. The principal

investigators at Columbia University and the University of Pennsylvania are researching the personal and environmental factors that inform students' academic program and career choices, such as individual beliefs, work and family responsibilities, affordability, social connections, and academic support programs. SRO is collecting webbased survey data in the Fall 2023, Spring 2024, and Fall 2024 academic semesters. The PIs are also collecting administrative student records and interview data.

For Wave 1, the community colleges shared contact information for 12,709 first-time students, including names, college emails, personal emails, and phone numbers. Production began on September 11. The Pls visited the four colleges for in-person recruitment, focusing on classes with high concentrations of first-year students. SRO sent emails in releases to the first-year students at each college on the first morning of the Pl visits to those colleges. The Pls brought an anonymous QR code to allow returning students in the classes to take the survey. During their visits, the Pls learned that many students did not know their college email addresses and (at one college) that a spam filter had flipped to block project emails from reaching students' inboxes. In those situations, the Pls pivoted to also give sample respondents access to the survey using the QR code. Thus, the site visits were critical in identifying and addressing barriers to the study's success.

Production was originally planned for 35 days but was less successful than expected and so was extended to 62 days. The PIs visited each college a second time, attending in-person and virtual classes. Over the course of the wave, SRO sent 8 emails using Qualtrics and a text message using Aerialink to recruit respondents. Surveys were programmed in English and Spanish. As a token of appreciation, respondents were emailed \$25 Visa electronic gift cards from U-M HSIP and Dash. In the final count, 4,515 (35%) sample respondents completed Wave 1 surveys and will be the starting sample for Waves 2-3.

The project did not have time or resources to develop a sample management system before Wave 1 launch, so SRO relied heavily on Qualtrics as a tool to manage sample, estimate completion counts, and distribute emails, which became very complicated due to several Qualtrics limitations.

Starting on March 11th, CCS will launch Wave 2. We will begin managing the sample in SRO's Web SMS, which will also be used to send messages, log reminder calls, and create production reports. In addition to emails and texts, we will mail invitation cards with \$5 cash prepayments, conduct reminder calling from the SSL, and offer respondents a choice between \$40 Visa e-gift cards, Amazon codes (sent by PIs due to constraints that we have with setting up Amazon business accounts), or cash. We will also revisit the colleges, this time giving talks to share select findings with respondents and college staff. Through these efforts, we hope to achieve a 50% Wave 2 response rate by the end of April.

Feel free to stop by at any time from 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. to pick up any items you want!


At 2:00 p.m., we will be packing up the room and taking items to be donated.

MEAL PREPPING LUNCH AND LEARN - Wednesday, February 28



Save Tab Groups in Chrome (Kelly Chatain)

I'll admit that I'm pretty excited about this one, SRO. Chrome has been working on this functionality for a bit and have finally worked out the last of the kinks in the latest release. You can now reliably create tab groups in Chrome and save them. To create a new tab group or add a tab to an existing group, right click on the tab and follow the prompt:



Once you've created the tab group, right click on the tab group name and enable 'Save Group'.



The saved groups will display on your bookmark bar and will remain there whenever you relaunch Chrome.
